

### YOU DONT LOOK LIKE A CHRISTIAN!



# LEARN A LITTLE SCRIPTURE...

John 15:9-10

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in His love"

Jesus is on his way to the cross and here he is giving his friends the disciples and us some very clear advice and assurance.

For St John, the word abide is really important. He tells us that Jesus is the Word who dwelt among us (1:14) and who invites the first disciples to come and see where He lives (1:39). The same John describes a revelation he has, which is what is described in the last book of the Bible, the Revelation, also known as the Apocalypse. Here John sees "the dwelling of God among humanity" (21:3). This is the final intention of our interaction with God that we will be in His home in Heaven.

#### Keeping Jesus's commandments

It's hard doing the same thing day in and day out. Finding the courage and will power to always do what's asked of you. Without running away, looking for short cuts or giving up.

Whether it's being responsible for your little sister, listening to your parents or keeping up that weekly trusted task, it can be tough, but we are never left alone with our struggles.

When can this scripture help us? When duty feels overwhelming or endless, or if we are struggling to stay on a path, keep to a promise or commitment whether it's to God or others. Think about this scripture.

He asks us only one thing: to abide in him, remain in his ways and we receive the limitless immeasurable love He has for us.

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
