

One of the most thought-provoking places I've been is an orphanage near Bethlehem. Recently we've seen quite a lot in the news of the violence happening there and it's been happening for centuries. Christians don't have a place we all need to go on pilgrimage to but Jerusalem is important for us, as well as for Muslims and Jews. In the 1940s it was split up so the different groups each had a part of the city. The Psalmist encourages us to pray for the peace of Jerusalem, writing over 2,500 years ago (Psalm 122:6).

In the orphanage the children had experienced much sadness, their parents often violently killed because of the violence. They lived in very basic conditions. And they had their home constantly invaded by pilgrims like me being taken on tours! Despite all this, they were cheerful. This wasn't blind optimism but a gift of their Christian faith. They continue to inspire me when I'm tempted to think I have nothing to be grateful for.
