FAIR PAY

The Church has long supported the work of Trades Unions, especially in arguing that those who work should be employed properly. This is a matter of justice. We define justice as meaning giving what is due to people. We owe certain things to God and should give those to Him. We owe certain things to others and justice demands we are diligent in doing that. We have to love people in different ways (consider how you love your parents in a different way to how you love your friends, for example).

One of the challenges about how God works concerning what is fair comes when we read the parable Jesus tells in St Matthew 20:1-16, the Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard. The landowner pays the labourers the same amount even though some have worked all day and others only an hour. It's grossly unfair and the workers grumble about it. However, the parable is there to teach us the huge generosity of God who despite the pathetic nature of our discipleship still chooses to give us all the benefits of His love.

In our day-to-day life we should make sure people are given a fair wage. Justice demands that work is rewarded properly. But we also have to realise that when it comes to our relationship with God we can never merit our salvation or keep Him happy by giving Him scraps of our time or our money or our lives. It is only God's generosity that means we'll get to Heaven but our lives have to live radiating that immense love.
